

Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year! I am the 3rd/4th grade elementary school teacher here at CAWNY, Mrs. Jones. I am so very excited to start this new year! My classroom curriculum will be filled with engaging hands-on activities, experiments, and new concepts. Students are going to be learning multiplication, division, the writing process, and so much more! I actively encourage my learners to shine brightly in our classroom and *Be the Light* (Matthew 5:14). I feel so blessed to be part of this Christ-centered school and can't wait to connect with all the wonderful students. Looking forward to all the fun and learning ahead!



The Earth Science class is a NY State Regents class which will cover the scope defined by NY State. A 16 page reference guide will be provided to each student which can be used for all tests. Students will learn about the sun, moon and

stars, space, Earth interior, rocks and minerals, atmosphere, weather and geologic history.

This year the class will be taught via two consecutive periods, 2 days a week. This will include assignments from the textbook, regents handouts, lab work and testing. The longer class periods should allow more time to complete work in class which will reduce homework for diligent students. All assignments will be posted on Google classroom. *Mr. Doores*

Welcome to 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade. I am so excited to be teaching this year. This year the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be spending their days exploring the history of the United States from its first beginnings as home to Native Americans, to early discovery and exploration by European adventurers and how it has evolved into the nation it is today. The combined classes will also be <u>Observing God's World</u> through study of both plants and animals and the Earth and space.

Fifth Graders will be going on a <u>Reading Quest</u>, while learning grammar and writing skills. Sixth graders will spend time reading with Mrs. Farrington and practice grammar and writing skills with Mrs. Taylor. Math for 5<sup>th</sup> grade will build on last year and expand in decimals and fractions. For 6<sup>th</sup> graders math will expand on decimals and fractions and introduce pre-algebraic concepts. Parents can expect their children to have some work to be completed at home as the day will be filled with so much learning that we won't be able to complete everything in class. The work will mainly be independent projects, with a small amount of homework that wasn't able to be finished in class. Mrs. Taylor

There is a lot of fun music to experience this year! Each class begins with a psalm of praise and singing to the Lord as we explore hymns and Christian music, and the history behind the songs we sing. High school students will focus on music appreciation and music theory as we study different genres of music & composers. They will also have opportunity to make their own music. Elementary and middle school will grow as music makers as we play instruments and sing to the Lord through stories and song. They will learn to work together as a team through music and movement as they play and sing worship songs each week! And....we are looking for donations of ukuleles and xylophones (not toy ones).



This year in our ELA programs we will be having reading enrichment classes for grades 3-7. We will be developing critical thinking skills in reading through inference, analysis, & citations. Grade 7 will be developing their grammar skills along with writing skills in the areas of paragraphs & essays. Grades 8-9 develop their ability to understand & use figurative language in reading & writing. They continue to develop their ability to write excellent

essays as well as learning literary analysis. Grades 10-11 will become excellent writers in essays, literary analysis, and critical thinking skills. Various novels will also be read, discussed, and analyzed throughout the year for all groups. Our seniors will be working on British literature and analysis through a rigorous online program. *Mrs. Farrington* 



During these first few weeks of school the different history classes will be studying assorted topics. These include an overview of different history philosophies, the beginnings of world and American history. Some will also study logical fallacies. U.S. government will be the topic for the seniors for the first half of the year. In all this we need to understand that "History is His Story." -Mr. Evans
